If so, Division 5 will be having a day to railfan the stretch of CSXT and NS tracks from North East, PA to Lake City, PA, with a lunch stop at the Lake Shore Railway Museum. This is wine country, as the rails roll through a lot of vineyards and orchards. We'll start the day's activities near the New York and Pennsylvania boundary, at the old steel bridge at Bort Road in North East. This is a great place to catch trains, as

the CSXT and NS tracks are almost directly adjacent to one another, and photos can be taken from the bridge directly, from the roadway, or of CSXT shooting under the bridge. The plan will be to leave early and arrive by 9:00 AM to hopefully catch quite a lot of action. Around noon, we'll grab something for lunch in North East, or bring your own sandwich and eat by the museum. Lake Shore Railway Museum is adjacent to the CSX's and Norfolk Southern's Buffalo to Chicago

mainlines. We'll tour the museum and see if we can catch any trains at this location. Afterwards we'll head for home, but not before stopping near the other side of Pennsylvania in the Lake City/Girard area. This is another nice location to catch some trains with the restored depot in the background. ☘

National Train Show Report.

Cobo Hall in downtown Detroit was the site of the 2007 NMRA Convention and National Train Show. While I didn't attend the convention, I, along with Don Thomas and about 50 members of Division 4, did travel to the Train Show on the Division 4 sponsored bus. Arriving shortly after the doors to the show opened on Saturday, we had the chance to see all of the exhibits and displays that the show had to offer. Cobo Hall is a large exhibition and conference center,

and the train show occupied a large part of the 1st floor exhibit space. Based on the floor plan, approximately 300 manufacturers, vendors, model railroad layouts and others exhibited on the floor. While this certainly seems like a lot of model railroad exhibitors, with quite a lot of potential to showcase new products or services, I thought the show was on the average side. Based on comments I heard from other members of our bus entourage, the general consensus was that the show didn't come close to equaling the quality or quantity of ex-

hibits as some of the past National Train shows. Many of the major manufacturers weren't present, or didn't have very large displays of new products. One of the biggest disappointments that I found was the quality of some of the manufacturers booths, which ranged from those manned by many sales people but not showcasing much new equipment to a few booths where no company reps were even present. Of course there were many booths that had some great new products, such as Rapido Trains (offering various highly de-

tailed passenger coaches), Sylvan Scale Models (some really detailed ship kits), Kato's new engines and rolling stock (both N and HO scales), Full Steam Ahead (detailed wooden craftsmen kits), Bar Mills (wooden building kits), Woodland Scenics (nice hands-on scenery making display), Blackstone Models (steam locos), Walther's (Milwaukee Road station), Intermountain (various rolling stock and engines) and Branchline Trains (various rolling stock).

As far as layouts went, there were certainly some beautiful and well-constructed modular layouts, with most of the scales represented. The biggest hit with the younger members I saw attending was the Lego layout displays. I think that I counted at least 4 large Lego layouts present, which were very interesting and showcased some intricate, detailed buildings as well as engines and rolling stock all created with Lego building blocks. Of course, the kids

seemed to more impressed with the large Lego Star Wars and Harry Potter creations than they were with the trains running through these mega cities. The Dayton N-Trak group seemed to have one of the larger layouts, which just seemed to go on and on and probably close to 100 modules but not enough trains running. The Mister Dave's Golden Blackhawk & Central City N scale layout was very impressive, with a quite a bit of detailed scenery and buildings. This layout was

awarded the Best of Show for Individual Modules. The Ford Model Railroad Club had a unique layout, which was running both a large scale and HO trains on part of the layout, with both lines running in a continuous loop but coming back to the interior part of their layout and running along separate shelves before going back out to the main trackage. It gave the appearance of two separate layouts, depending on which side of the long oval you were standing on. A few of the

other layouts worth mentioning were the Piute Flats Branch of the D&RGW, a small western theme N scale layout that was designed to give a 360 degree view of the layout. The Sipping & Switching Society of Denver, North Carolina brought their large modular layout, which featured a number of great-modeled scenes, including an approximate 12-foot long arched bridge with lots of detail beneath the bridge. ☘


Division 5 Meeting Minutes



The show opened at 10:00 AM and we got our tickets. **Cobo Hall**, in Detroit, was a large facility, about the same as the **I-X Center** here. We decided to walk up and down the aisles from the right. As the guys said, most of the manufacturers had booths showing their latest products. All the

big ones were there. Several had some nice interactive displays. **The Woodland Scenics** was one and they had many displays showing the different products and a person explaining their usage. The Athearn display was very nice also, as they were giving away pins for their 60 years in business. A visit to the Model Railroader booth proved fruitful, as they were giving away several publications, including Classic trains, Toy Trains and a guide to model railroading. 

Cuyahoga Valley Scenic Railroad Running a Steam Special

I just saw this while searching some of my usual websites for railfanning purposes and thought members might be interested. Steam will once again rumble through the Cuyahoga Valley when the Cuyahoga Valley Scenic Railroad runs a special

train on September 20th. The former Canadian Pacific 4-6-2 will pull the train. Built in 1948, the 80-ton coal-fired antique and her crew were donated for CVSR's use by the Ohio Central Railroad System. Narrators will highlight the history of Cuyahoga Valley and various

points of interest along the route. This special excursion will depart from the Rockside Station at 5:00 p.m. and travel south through the Cuyahoga Valley National Park to the Akron North side Station. The train will then make the return trip back through the Valley to Rockside Station. Costs

for the trip are provided in the CVSR's website (<http://www.cvsr.com/pages.php?alias=steam>). Let's hope for a sunny afternoon so that railfans can get some great photos. ☘
