Assistant Superintendant Report.

In a recent conversation, I mentioned my hobby is model railroading. I received a typical response of, "Oh, you play with trains!" Fifteen minutes later, the person realized how much more there is to playing with trains.

I think there are few model railroaders who realize exactly how much we learn with our hobby. Each of us are walking encyclopedias of data and detail that is often focused on a specific time, place and location. These details often involve historical, geographic, geologic, industrial, social, and engineering elements. If you are now rolling your eyes, then I recommend you ask Rich about the B&O Lake Branch. Ask Ted about a certain narrow gauge in Colorado. Ask Ken about a certain stretch of a Canadian railroad. Each of us has absorbed some details that we hold close and incorporate into some square footage of our homes where a miniature is under construction.

In conjunction with this collection of detail, we have all learned other skills as we progress in the hobby. I know

I've become pretty good at basic carpentry and engineering, electrical, drafting, design, photography, writing and even some painting. Each of us owns a different set of skills learned across our hobby years. Granted skills may have been learned for an employment opportunity, but those are often folded into the hobby knowledge. These various layers of skill and knowledge are what makes a rewarding lifelong hobby. A statement like "playing with trains" can sound so flat and one dimensional, but if people would understand the acquired skills and knowledge we enjoy when we play with our trains, then maybe they would find our hobby just as interesting in their lives.

Our monthly meetings are a great place to share our experiences. In our moments describing the bring and brag models, or listening to the presentation, or in the conversations we have with friends and newcomers, we add more layers of information that add to our hobby enjoyment. I'd like to think we come out of our meetings a little better than when we entered the

doors earlier in the evening. We had forty people at the last meeting, which is more than I've seen over the last year. If you can, bring a friend along so they can see how we play with trains.

Our next meeting will be held at the Farmpark. Billboard reeferers are the bring and brag topic and I'm certain we may see a banner number of display models. The HO modular layout will be up and running and I believe there will be a short presentation on the modules. I'll see you at the Farmpark on June 3rd!

The Division 5 Fiftieth Anniversary celebration will be held at Zappitelli's in Painesville. The Croation Lodge in East-lake will be the backup location if we cannot secure a desired date at Zappitelli's. We are trying for a Sunday afternoon/evening on either September 18th, 25th, or October 9th.

The Rails Of Ages convention finances are still being finalized. Initial indications are that the convention ended up with a profit. The convention chairmen are reviewing if we can refund some amount of the registration fee to the Division 5 volunteers.

We are still in need of a coordinator for Promo Day.

It was noted that we never gave Bob Frieden any money to help defray the costs of the last Promo Day. It was voted that we give Bob the remaining \$300 left in the Promo Day budget for 2010.

We have created a new volunteer position of Division 5 Layout Tour Coordinator but do not have anyone to fill it so far.

Tony Spena has volunteered to be one of the Division 5 auditors.

The Railfest 2011 financial books are to be audited by July 1, 2011. The Rails Of Ages financial books are to be audited by August 1, 2011.

Dick Roth suggested a Division trip to a model railroad and museum in New York. We are looking into it to see if it would be a viable trip for the Division members.

It was noted that a number of our Division documents and brochures on our website need to be updated. Eric Hansmann will review them and get the recommended changes to Matt Kross.

We are considering changing the Division 5 Regulations to move the Treasurer position from an elected position to an appointed position. This would allow the Treasurer to stay in the position for longer than the 4 years max of an elected office. This would provide better continuity, reduce the problem of finding someone to fill the position, and reduce the problem of changing the signatures on the bank accounts. We need to find out if there are any 501(c)3 restrictions that would keep us from doing this. Initial indications from the region are that this is okay to do. If there are no restrictions with us making this change, then we would need to put it to a vote of the Division 5 members.

We need programs for August through November.



The Modeler's Corner.



If your layout features a chemical plant and/or an elaborate refinery, then what could be more appropriate than an operating horse head drilling rig. The top three pictures show two finished Models made by Faller and the lower picture shows where the two models will eventually end up on my layout. Both of these smaller size models occupy a relatively small footprint. I talked to another hobbyist who built the Walthers model oil rig and when I compared notes, I found that they are comparatively equal in price but the Walthers rig is a lot harder to build. I found the Faller model quite easy

to assemble as there is very little glue used. The only problem with the Faller model is when you order the motor which does not come with the rig. It is almost twice the cost of the model. But I did not want a static model on my layout, so after the **sticker shock**, I just grinned and paid the bill. The two models were fun to build and they will be active in my oil fields. The rail cars that you would probably find in the area of these dynamic models will be mostly single and three dome tank cars. If you are presently working on a project, take plenty of pictures, write down some information on your project and join me in the **Modeler's Corner**.

In case you did not know, **The Western Reserve Model Railroad Museum** is in the midst of several estate sales. Not
