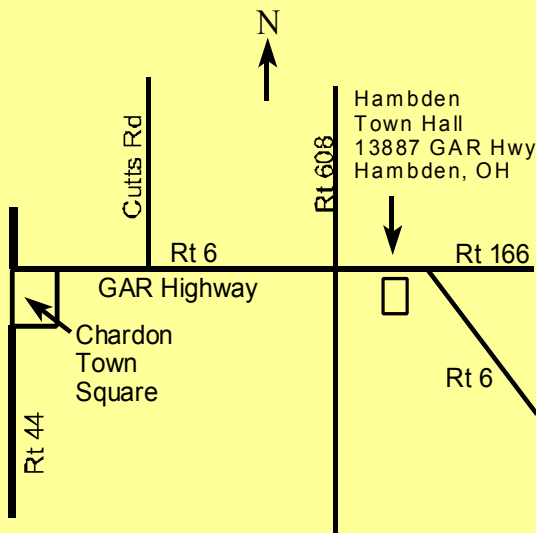

October 2, 2015

Pat Flash had several boxes of free magazines for those present at the meeting.

Upcoming events mentioned included the Painesville Depot fundraiser on October 12, Railfanning Day at the Painesville Depot on Oct 17, and a narrow gauge mini-convention being held in Kirtland, OH the weekend of Oct 17.

The layout tour guide for Division 5's tours on Oct 24 and Nov 7 was e-mailed to members. Paper copies were available at the meeting. Anyone needing a layout tour guide should contact Matt Kross. There are six layouts open on Oct 24 and four layouts on Nov 7.

Dave Neff will be meeting with the new director of Lake Farmpark to discuss the future of our layout setups there and other ways we can work together.

Lake Erie N-scale Society reported that they had completed their new power cart for their N-Trak modules and would be using it for the first time at Promo Day 2015. They thanked the Division for providing the funding for this project.

The Lake-Geauga HO Modular Group reported that they are rebuilding their four corner modules along with about 12 to 14 straight modules.

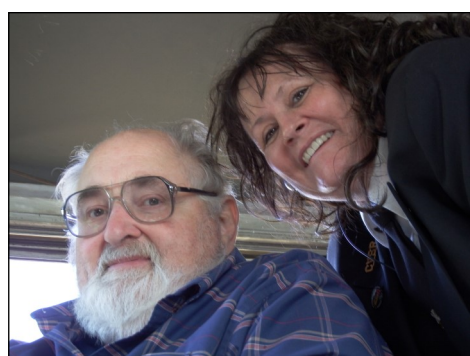

years of volunteering on this unique railroad. Arriving at the Akron Station, I was *not* overly impressed with the experience even though the ride down was quite comfortable. I was really

After the changing of crews and meeting Debbie our hostess and tour guide, I was invited to climb up into one side of the cupola which had one of the best seats in the house. The chairs were like wide captain's chairs heavily padded and very comfortable. I could easily see

the front of the train through the front window and the engine behind the caboose through the back window. While the chair could be turned 180 degrees, it takes two men and a boy to lift the seat and turn it completely around. The comfortable seat is attached to a cast iron support that is bolted to boiler plate floor but

once it is in place it's the greatest seat on the train. On this unique trip traveling in a caboose cupola despite the blaring horn and fumes from the engine when he puts the pedal to the medal, you are in for one hell of a ride; one I would repeat in a heartbeat. I sure hope we take this trip next year.

The North Platte Experience

Horace Greely gets credit for that famous phrase, "Go West young man, go West". That was 150 years ago and meant for young men and their families to go west in search of their fortunes and to grow with this magnificent country. Fast forward 150 years and now we have two old farts well into their 70's going west to take part in the festivities of **Railfest 2015** in North

Platte, Nebraska. Bob Frieden and I rode together because everyone else, six other people, had partnered up and had their plans *etched in stone*. Two couples were traveling by train and two other fellas were traveling by car. So these free spirits (**Bob and I**) decided to wing it and see what was *going* on out west, with the intent to end up in North Platte sometime on Friday September 18th, 2015. Keep in mind, we have two grumpy old men both

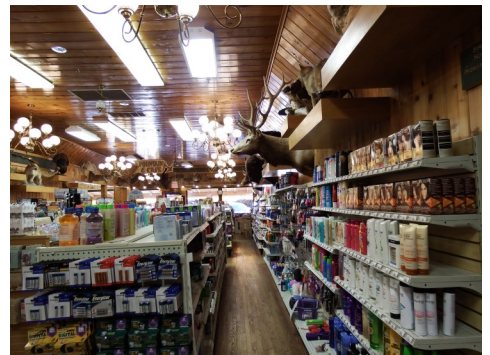
with physical impediments, one that has to use a walker. Both men are dominant, gruff, sometimes cantankerous, irritable, extremely opinionated, and always ready to jump into a verbal argument with no holds barred and have **never** traveled together. What could possibly go wrong with this scenario? On **Monday 9/14** I picked up Bob at 7:30 **am** and we were on our way, no turning back now. We drove thru Ohio, Indiana and into



Illinois. At the last minute we agreed to skirt around Chicago by staying on Int. 80 and go north on Rt. 39 to Wisconsin. Once in Wisconsin the terrain turned flat with dozens of wind mills on several wind farms, a sight unfamiliar to me. At sunset after a long 10 hour drive, this odd couple settled in La Cross, Wisconsin at

the Days Inn on an island in the middle of the Mississippi River. On **Tuesday**

9/15 before we got started both of us agreed on seven simple rules to help us get along for the week long trip. 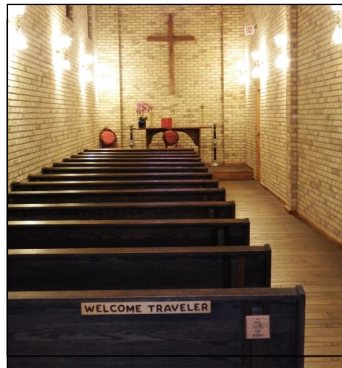

and don't make me spend one night in jail." Works for me. After crossing the Mississippi River and into Minnesota there were more windmills, open country, plenty of wind and flatter terrain. The journey across the state took about 4 ½ hours. Now in South Dakota the scenery has changed to prairies, rolling grass lands and very few trees. Never having been in this part of the country, I was amazed at the fantastic

views from all angles. Next stop was the unique Wall drug store in Wall, South Dakota. Hundreds of signs and billboards along all the highways direct travelers from miles away to this rare shopping experience. The Wall Drug Store, *a story in itself*, occupies a complete city block. Bob and I toured this unique complex where you can find every imaginable trinket including statuettes, figurines, cups, mugs, post

cards, greeting cards, office supplies, signs, posters, Christmas ornaments, gifts, souvenirs, games and jewelry. There are countless taxidermy wild animals including an owl, turkeys, bobcats, deer, elk, antelopes, bears, a coyote, a large bison head and several improbable *jack-a-lobes*. Once you walk through several stores that also stock T-shirts, sweat shirts, hats, caps, pennants and other tourist attire you



finally step into an inside mall with various small stores. There you can find almost anything from pharmaceutical products, clothes, western gear and attire, souvenirs of all kinds, to a harness shop and a machine with a gypsy inside that will tell you your future. There is a cafeteria where you can grab a quick

meal and a small chapel where you can find a little spiritual guidance among the commercial chaos. The shop and mall area are peppered with wooden hand carved life-size figures standing around or sitting on park benches that line the mall. I stopped and talked to a fellow Ohioan who was sitting next to a wooden

Annie Oakley who also was an Ohioan. One could easily get lost for hours on end but after a couple of hours, we were back on the highway and ended up in Rapid City, South Dakota @ the Econolodge just as it started to get dark. *To be continued....*
