





Dennison Depot & Museum

Besides NMRA Division 5 I belong to a few (my wife would say a ton) other train organizations; one of which being is the TCA. Our local chapter does a first Tuesday of the month luncheon at a restaurant followed up with a local train activity, usually this means seeing someone's layout. However, in June we took a trip to Dennison, Ohio and explored the Dennison Depot and Museum. I had never heard of this museum so I didn't know what to anticipate and honestly I was expecting just a small railroad depot, not the rather large and diverse offerings I discovered.

The whole place pays homage to its heyday which was WWII, where it served as a Salvation Army Servicemen's Canteen. It served as a stop for troop trains along the National Defense Strategic Railway, providing free food and refreshments to over 1.3 million service members. The depot's hospitality earned it the nickname "Dreamsville, USA" from the soldiers.

There are numerous passenger cars with different exhibits in each one. My favorites were the mascot dog exhibit along with the local baseball exhibit; but there were many others. Some of the equipment that you can see includes: Chesapeake and Ohio 2-8-4 #2700, Nickel Plate Caboose #454, Baltimore and Ohio 90' steel passenger car, Pennsy Parlor Car #7007, Wabash #5170 Railway Post Office Car, and a Rare WWII Hospital and Surgery Car. As bonus you can even book a night in the Pullman Car through AIRBNB which also includes breakfast in the morning.

For those looking to visit the Museum is open Tuesday through Sunday and the cost is very reasonable \$8 adults \$6 Seniors and to honor their sacrifice veterans and active duty military are always free.





Crowds of people were amazed at the work put in by both clubs. The only times there seemed to be a lull happened during lunch and the hour prior to closing. Of course, this kind of turnout is fantastic for our organization's main goal: To promote model railroading and particularly N-Scale model railroading.

LENS and Mod Squad have another reason to be proud of this weekend. This year we were able to entertain the Miracle League of Northeast Ohio once more. This year's event was especially heartwarming, as both clubs were gifted a photo collage from varying events the league participated in, along with a custom plaque thanking us for our support. Which was all of us gladly staying an extra 2 hours so that their athletes could have a private experience at Railroads in the Park.







