

#### **Division 5 Membership Meeting Minutes**

October 4, 2024

The October 4, 2024 membership meeting was held at Hambden Township Hall. The meeting was called to order at 7:30 PM by Superintendent Bill Osborne. There were 22 members and two guests present.

Welcomed new member Gretchen Bryan.

Next year's NMRA convention in Novi, MI is looking for clinicians.

The Mod Squad and LENS groups reported on how their recent modular setups at Lake Farmpark's Horse-power Weekend went. Overall, the modules ran well but the event attendance was down significantly this year due to bad weather.

Railfest 2025 planning is progressing. The committee now has the Railfest laptop and is going through the 2024 information. They are working on updating the various form letters and lists in preparation for sending out invitations to vendors and exhibitors. They are looking at various advertising approaches.

The new area HO module group had its initial meeting but only three people showed up. A lot more people than this have expressed interest in the group. The next meeting will be held at the Munson fire station.

A Division 5 trip to the Youngstown and Sebring model railroad clubs is planned for Saturday, November 9, 2024. Details will be in the November Trainwire. Those people wanting to carpool should meet in the Chardon Walmart's parking lot before 9:00am. The trip will essentially have the same itinerary as last year's.

We will have a Division 5 dinner on Saturday, November 9, 2024 around 6pm. This is the same day as the trip to the model railroad clubs but will be held after the group returns. You do not need to go on the trip to the model railroad clubs to go to the dinner. Just meet at the restaurant around 6pm. Details will be in the November Trainwire. We will try to have the dinner at Mary Yoder's restaurant in Middlefield, OH, but we have to check on availability.

Financial audits of the Division's and Railfest 2024's books have been completed and no problems were found.

We will try to have our Division picnic next year. We will start the planning process for it sooner next year so that we don't run into problems like we did this year.

Reminder that Entertrainment Junction near Cincinnati, OH will be closing January 1, 2025. Time is running out for you to go and see it. There are lots of other attractions to see in that area such as the recently remodeled Cincinnati Union Terminal and the Sign Museum.

- It was decided to keep the Division 5 2025 budget the same as the budget for 2024.
- The division auditors reported that the financial audits of the Division's and Railfest 2024's books have been completed and no problems were found. Formal audit reports were submitted to the BOD.
- Signatures on the Division's and Railfest's bank accounts have been updated for the new officers and Railfest chairman.
- The Railfest Planning Committee is currently going through the vendor list and updating various things in the Railfest documentation.
- We don't have a meeting program for November. We will look into showing an online video of some rail-roading topic.
- We will definitely have our Division trip to the Youngstown and Sebring model railroad clubs on Saturday, November 9, 2024. Details will be in the November Trainwire. Superintendent Osborne is coordinating this.
- We will have a Division 5 dinner on Saturday, November 9, 2024 around 6pm, after the model railroad club trip returns. Details are still being worked out and will be in the November Trainwire. Superintendent Osborne is coordinating this.
- We will have our annual Holiday Party in January 2025. Our target date is Saturday, January 11, 2025 and be held at the Hambden Town Hall. We need to check on the availability of the hall. We will see if we can again get the food from Mary Yoder's Restaurant in Middlefield, OH. We need someone to coordinate the food end of the party. For entertainment, Bill Osborne is trying to put together a photo show of the Division's 2024 events, we will have our annual Loser's Raffle coordinated by Bonnie Lette, and we will have a special raffle for all participants coordinated by Matt Kross.
- We gained one new member in the last month but had four members not renew their membership. Three of these were Rail Pass members.
- The Clerk is still working on getting the mail ballots prepared for the membership to vote on the proposed changes to the Division 5 Regulations. These should be going out soon.
- The revised requirements for the Division 5 Model Railroad Display Award were published and put on our website
- The BOD is looking into having some Division tabletop publicity signs made. A first pass at a design was presented. Pricing will be obtained.
- The BOD received a report from the Mod Squad modular group outlining how they spent the grant money they received from Division 5 in 2024.
- The next Div 5 BOD meeting will be on Monday, November 11, 2024, at 7:30pm online using Zoom. (Note: Normally, BOD meetings are held on even numbered months from February to October and then in November and not in December.)

### Summer Travels Part 3—Georgia

The next stop in my journey was the state of Georgia and I had numerous activities planned for this leg, so my stay was actually going to be over a few days. The first stop was to explore the world's largest auction house (Trainz.com) dedicated just to model trains. This came about as one of their managers Cindy is a member of our MOD Squad Facebook page and has always said if anyone is in the area stop by for a tour. I was very impressed with just how many trains they process daily. Currently they are in four very big buildings but they are not located in close proximity. They are currently building their own humongous warehouse so they can have all the offices and warehouse under one roof. As I was touring I can definitely see why they need all the extra space. Now of course during this tour if I saw anything that I had on my list they were more than willing to sell it to me. The funny part of this tour was at the end when I noticed a large pile of train boxes next to a desk. I commented that looks like a big order and Cindy stated actually this is your order. Apparently when I left to start this trip she ran a sale on our MOD Facebook page called "Bryan is taking a tour get free shipping he will bring it back for you". So some of my friends took her up on the offer and they filled my back seat with all of their purchases. It was all in good fun and actually pretty funny.

Of course with my back all filled up I wasn't able to purchase anything at my next stop Legacy Station. Although if I would have found anything on my list someone's items (Nathan's) would have been left on the side of the road to make room. This hobby shop is neatly organized and they have

a very nice O gauge layout in a side room that anyone can visit.

On the second day of the visit I planned stops at both the Southern Museum of Civil War and Locomotive History in Kennesaw, GA and the Southeastern Railway Museum in Deluth, GA. The first location was the Civil War/Locomotive Museum. Since this is a Smithsonian Museum I knew the displays would be first class and I was not disappointed. Every artifact had detailed displays describing exactly what you were viewing including another of the Merci boxcars described earlier in my Kentucky article. The main attraction of the Museum is the actual General Locomotive from the famous Civil War story "The Great Locomotive Chase". If you are not familiar with this historic adventure I highly recommend finding the 1956 movie by the same title and watching it. Inside they museum they have a short 10 minute movie but you really have to watch the 1956 film to appreciate just how adventurous of a plan this was. I have seen the movie in the past but to actually see the locomotive and the artifacts in real life was awe inspiring. There is another room dedicated to the memory of each of the soldiers that took place in the raid and their eventual fate.

After battling Atlanta traffic I finally made it over to the Southeastern Railway Museum. This Museum is both inside and outside and of course on the over 100 degree day I welcomed the indoor exhibits greatly. There is one building dedicated to WW2 and post war nostalgia in what seems like an older station depot. At the back of the property they have another building with some nice displays and a HO train layout off to the side. My favorite display was the different place settings for many of the railroad lines, when passenger service was at its

peak. The railroads really took pride in how they served their passengers back then. Outside their was a good mixture of engines, boxcars, passenger cars, and unique items from all different time periods. The one I found most interesting was the Pullman Car that President Harding used during his presidency. Finally your admission ticket gives you a choice to ride the 1/8 scale train around the mu-

seum grounds or take a 15 minute ride on one of their little switchers that they run on a siding on the property. My choice was made for me as the volunteer who runs the 1/8 scale train stopped running it once the temperature went over 100 degrees that day. I guess that just gives me an excuse to visit again.










































### Around the Layout
